

NORTH WHIDBEY SPORTSMEN'S ASSOCIATION CLUB RULES AND CODE OF CONDUCT

Revised 11/2017

A. THREE GUN HANDLING SAFETY RULES:

1. Always keep the gun pointed in a safe direction.
2. Always keep your finger off the trigger until you're ready to shoot.
3. Always keep the gun unloaded until ready to use.

B. UNSAFE GUN HANDLING: Defined as any manipulation of a firearm that places any person or property at risk of injury or death. This includes, but is not limited to:

1. Pointing guns (loaded or unloaded) at or toward any person or property not intended to absorb bullets.
2. Placing a finger inside the trigger guard unless pointing the gun at a target in preparation for shooting.

C. RANGE RULES: The following rules apply equally to all firearms and archery ranges.

1. Range hours – Monday through Saturday, 8AM to 9PM. Sunday, 1200 noon to 9PM. Rifle and archery ranges close at dusk.
2. Hearing protection and impact resistant eye protection are required by everyone on all firearms ranges.
3. All uncased, unholstered firearms must be unloaded, with actions open and magazines/clips removed, except when preparing to fire on the firing line. Uncased long guns must be carried muzzle up or muzzle down.
4. Handling guns while anyone is downrange or forward of the firing line is prohibited. When anyone is down range all guns must be benched, bagged or holstered. Everyone must remain at least three (3) feet away from any benched gun. Benched guns must be unloaded, and actions open. Archers may not have an arrow nocked when anyone is down range.
5. Do not shoot at barricades, buildings, benches, or other club property.
6. Do not shoot at aerial targets with solid projectiles.
7. A metal shotgun patterning board is available on the trap range. Largest shot size allowed is #7 ½, lead only, loaded in 2 ¾" field and target shells only. Patterning shot larger than #7 ½ allowed only on pistol range on privately owned targets.
8. Remove all shell casing, misfired, faulty ammo, empty ammo boxes and target frames. Reloadable brass casings may be left in provided brass buckets. Pack it in, pack it out!
9. Only #7 ½ shot or smaller, lead only, 2 ¾" field and target shells may be used on the trap range.
10. No hunting on NWSA property.
11. Red "bravo" flag at the range being used must be raised by the first person entering the range, and lowered by the last person leaving the range.
12. When shooting rapid fire strings, all shots must be kept within a 16" diameter circle, centered in the target area of the target frame. If shots cannot be kept inside the 16" circle shooter must slow rate of fire, move closer, or both.
13. Shoot only at targets that are protected by earthen embankment backstops, exceptions only for shotguns firing shot shells and archery on the trap and archery ranges. To ensure bullets aren't fired over any berm on rifle or pistol ranges, muzzles of all firearms must remain below top of downrange and side berms when action is closed. Ensure that bullets do not impact ground short of backstop. No targets allowed on or at the top of ANY berm on the rifle range.
14. Use of alcohol and drugs is prohibited on all ranges. No one under the influence of alcohol or drugs is allowed on any firing range.
15. Trap Range and Rifle range cannot be used simultaneously for personal use. When one is in use the other is closed. **Use of radios for range coordination during sanctioned, organized Trap Shoots is authorized**
16. On rifle and pistol ranges only paper or cardboard targets may be used, attached to personally owned target frames, placed in club installed target frame holders, except for organized events when a Range Officer is present. No other targets are authorized. Target frames will be made according to club specifications. Frames are available through club sponsored Boy Scout Troop.
17. Logbooks provided at each range are required to be filled out by all members and guests, and include date, arrival time, and departure time. Range Master for organized events may sign in/out for group, indicating number of participants using the range.
18. Use of NWSA Ranges is at your own risk.
19. All NWSA members are required to wear membership cards as an ID badge on front, outside of outer garment when on club property.

D. GUESTS:

1. Guests may be brought onto NWSA property to use the facilities.
2. Club member acting as sponsor is responsible for the actions of their guests.
3. Sponsor must ensure that all club and safety rules are followed.
4. Sponsor must remain with guest for the duration of the guest's visit.
5. Guests may not enter club property unescorted.
6. No member may use the NWSA club facilities or property to conduct business without the prior and express written consent of the NWSA Board of Trustees.

E. ENFORCEMENT OF RULES:

1. Every member is responsible for knowledge and enforcement of the rules and bylaws of the club. NWSA bylaws are available at www.northwhidbeysportsmen.org
2. At a minimum, inform the shooter of rule violation. If the shooter is uncooperative or violation is serious get vehicle license number and name, and name of sponsor if violator is a guest, and report the situation to a club officer, including time and date of incident.
