Annual Work Requirement

Starting January 1, renewals will need to show they've completed 12 hours of work for the club. If a renewing member does not have 12 hours of service, their membership will include a \$100 surcharge. But there is a way to reduce that cost: Work for the club! The new requirement is 12 hours per year doing something to enhance and help our club be the kind of place you want to come shoot, every 10 or 15 minutes counts, it all adds up.

A suggested list is attached to this Newsletter. It is the individual members responsibility to keep track, and submit their list with their renewal in order to keep their dues at the lower amount of \$100. We are now holding monthly working parties, starting at 11am on the Sundays after the meetings which will give plenty of opportunities to get 12 hours in before you renew.

Renewals without the hours requirement (\$200) will be available online. To submit your hours with your \$100 renewal fee you will need to print and mail it or present it in person at the meeting.

North Whidbey Sportsmen's Association Annual Service to the club Member's Report

This report is required to accompany the NWSA Membership Renewal Form.

12 hours service to NWSA is required per year of membership. Failure to perform 12 hours service results in an additional \$100 added to the membership fee.

Service may be anything that contributes to the betterment or operations of the club. If it's a service to NWSA and requires the member's time, it qualifies. Examples are:

- Labor—including working on buildings, mowing, grounds improvement, brush/undergrowth control, road maintenance, range maintenance, equipment maintenance.
- Administrative functions, including managing guest waivers, managing the AED maintenance, assisting with any NWSA Administration duty.
- Serving as a Certified Range Safety Officer (hours on duty qualify)
- Serving as a Match Director (hours managing matches and prep work qualify)
- Serving as an NRA Instructor (hours instructingand preparing qualify)
- Serving with the kitchen crew
- Hunter's Education (hours instructingand preparing qualify)
- Anything that directly contributes to the benefit of NWSA
